Carl Jung was one of the creators of modern depth psychology, which seeks to facilitate a conversation with the unconscious energies which move through each of us. He contributed many ideas which continue to inform contemporary life, among them: complex, archetype, persona, shadow, anima and animus, personality typology, dream interpretation and individuation. He had a deep appreciation of our creative life and considered spirituality a central part of the human journey. His method of interpretation of symbolic expression not only deepens our understanding of personal material, opening the psychodynamics of our personal biographies and dreams, but the deeper, collective patterns which develop within culture as well. In his memoir, Memories, Dreams, Reflections, Jung wrote that meaning comes "when people feel they are living the symbolic life, that they are actors in the divine drama. That gives the only meaning to human life; everything else is banal and you can dismiss it. A career, producing of children, is all maya (illusion) compared to that one thing, that your life is meaningful."

Life has always seemed to me like a plant that lives on its rhizome. Its true life is invisible, hidden in the rhizome. The part that appears above ground lasts only a single summer. Then it withers away — an ephemeral apparition. When we think of the unending growth and decay of life and civilizations, we cannot escape the impression of absolute nullity. Yet I have never lost a sense of something that lives and endures underneath the eternal flux. What we see is the blossom, which passes. The rhizome remains.

We're very pleased to welcome our newest board member, Joel Kroeker, who was elected to the board at the 2010 AGM. Joel has been a long-standing member of the society, and we are ecstatically happy that he has offered to be the manager of our new website.



Joel is a music therapist who has returned to Vancouver after completing his graduate training in music-centred psychotherapy. He is currently developing a new therapeutic method called Archetypal Music Psychotherapy (AMP) that integrates core Jungian principles within a clinical improvisation framework. Since 2008 Joel has enjoyed leading individual and group music therapy sessions in adult mental health contexts, medium secure forensic units, and with persons dealing with issues of anxiety, depression, addictions and dual diagnosis psychiatric issues. Joel has also worked with the elderly, at-risk youth and children with developmental delays. He also holds a Masters degree in Ethnomusicology, which has led to a keen interest in cross-cultural clinical work which has included CBT clinical training through the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine. Joel has training in Guided Imagery and Music (GIM) through Capilano University and has just concluded a low-frequency vibro-acoustic chair research study through the Laurier Centre for Music Therapy Research. Before becoming a therapist, Joel spent a decade of his life traveling the world as an international recording artist.

The Program Advisory Group has now met twice (May/10 & Jan/11) to discuss programming ideas, issues and potential presenters. The PAG meetings are organized and chaired by our Program Co-ordinator, Pohsuan Zaide, and members include Anne Bosch, Ana Mozol, David Roomy, Marlene Schiwy and all of the board. Both meetings were very congenial and productive, and our dialogue benefited from the extensive knowledge, experience, and commitment of everyone present. Marion Woodman: Dancing in the Flames




February 18 7:30 pm Introduced by Marlene Schiwy

Pauli's Dream, Jung, Modern Physics Alchemy

April 15 7:30 pm



C. G. Jung devoted much of his life to exploring the dark borderland between psyche and matter. While engaged in that inquiry, he was drawn to the phenomena of contemporary physics. Jung's fascination with physics was heightened by his long-term relationship with Nobel prize-winning physicist Wolfgang Pauli, and the two creative geniuses spent years together mulling over the mysteries of quantum reality.

Just what is it about modern physics that invites intimate contact with the psyche? In examining this question, we're led to recognize the broader need to set physics and psychology on a whole new philosophical foundation – one more in keeping with the integrative worldview of alchemy studied by Jung, than with the dualistic paradigm of conventional science. In fact, this revolutionary development is foreshadowed in several of Pauli's dreams and our evening will begin and end by contemplating two of them.



Steven M. Rosen is Emeritus Professor of Psychology at the City University of New York. After receiving his Ph.D. in experimental psychology from the City University in 1971, Dr. Rosen began to explore the foundations and frontiers of science, with his work becoming interdisciplinary and philosophical in nature. He has lectured internationally, and his essays have appeared in a variety of journals and collections spanning the fields of philosophy, psychology, theoretical physics, education, semiotics, and ecology.

Dr. Rosen's books include:
The Self-Evolving Cosmos (2008),
Topologies of the Flesh (2006),
Dimensions of Apeiron (2004)
Science, Paradox, and the Moebius Principle (1994)
Each of these works features a significant focus on Jung.



In honour of the 50th anniversary of Jung's death (June 6, 1961), we will be showing film material related to Jung's life & work.


We'll have refreshments & conversation afterwards, with a discussion, time-permitting.


